I 🚨 THE ROAD MAINTENANCE DISPARITY

While working-class residents navigate crumbling streets, Apple Valley's leadership enjoys freshly paved roads through exclusive foothill estates. Public records reveal:

55%

of road resurfacing funds (2020-2025) flowed to neighborhoods housing 3/5 city council members - areas requiring extraordinary maintenance due to their precarious hillside locations.

THE PROPERTY GAP

Council home values:

31-186%

above Apple Valley's \$420,000 median

COST DISPARITY

Foothill road maintenance:

\$480,000/mile

vs. \$110,000/mile in flat areas

When municipal funds prioritize geologically unstable luxury zones, whose lifestyle are we subsidizing?

The math is stark: foothill roads received 4.3x more funding per mile than working-class areas since 2020.

THE SYSTEMIC INJUSTICE

How Municipal Financing Favors Wealthy Neighborhoods

THE FORGOTTEN STREETS

Working-class Rimrock:

- Last resurfaced 2017-2019
- · Received only 8% of recent funds

Low-income South Apple Valley:

- Zero full resurfacing since 2015
- Pothole patches only
- Unincorporated areas rely on neglected county budgets

THE SYSTEMIC ENGINE

This isn't overt corruption - it's how municipal financing inherently favors wealth:

- 1. Foothill roads degrade 3-5x faster, creating "urgent" budget requests
- 2. Property assessments generate more revenue from luxury zones
- 3. Engineering codes mandate costly solutions for unstable terrain

The result: A system that frames subsidizing hillside luxury as "essential maintenance."

TAKE ACTION

- Demand CIP Reports at council meetings
- Cross-reference parcel maps with paving schedules
- Question "slope stabilization" that benefits private views
- Attend July 1 council meeting (Item #4: Infrastructure Equity)
